The Village of Greenwood Lake is an incorporated Municipality in Orange County. We are home to Orange County's largest lake and are within the borders of the Town of Warwick. Our lake borders the state of New Jersey and is recreated by thousands of people from all over the country every month. In the Village we have several hotels and bed and breakfast locations, but have struggled in the past to draw new tourists into the community. Outdoor recreation and highlighting our lake has been a major endeavor over the past 3 years in Greenwood Lake. We have striven to create tourism opportunities and ways to drive people to Greenwood Lake and Orange County.

The Village is a recreation destination not only for Orange County residents but for the hundreds of thousands of residents who live within a 30 mile radius and the millions who live within a 50 mile radius. This project, a passive boat launch which encourages outdoor recreation, fishing and nature watching, will increase tourism, retain visitors for longer periods of time through having more activities, will create an additional part time grounds keeper position to maintain the park, and will create a gateway park to the Village of Greenwood Lake. At present, the County owned property which is being transferred to the Village of Greenwood Lake for \$100.00 is vacant and unattractive. In short, the property is going to waste. With the funds received from the IDA, the Village of Greenwood Lake, working in partnership with the Town of Warwick, will transform this vacant gateway to our Village into a beautiful park and recreation destination. The overall request is \$52,100.00. The site will consist of attractive landscaping that mixes well with the area's natural features, parking, lighting, a groomed lawn for picknicking, park benches, a boat launch and dock. All maintenance will be performed by Village of Greenwood Lake employees and all liability for the launch will be maintained by the Village of Greenwood Lake.

The proposed use of IDA funds would be to construct a fully functional passive boat launch and public park in the Village of Greenwood Lake. This is a joint effort between the Town of Warwick and Village of Warwick to spur more economic development and interest in the Greater Greenwood lake Community.

The property, formerly a County Road and side road with lakefront access, became inactive nearly 20 years ago with the reconfiguration of County Route 5. The Village is currently finalizing plans to purchase property for #100.00. The proposed use would be a passive boat launch that would provide much needed public access to Orange County's largest lake. Passive boats would be kayaks, canoes, row boats and small boats that generally may be put into water without the use of a trailer. Greenwood Lake has been well known as one of the best fishing lakes in NY but this has declined over the past decade. The cost of launching boats at local marinas for passive boats is, in many cases, cost prohibitive. By allowing public access to this site, we are bringing more people to the Village for recreational purposes, which in turn, drive more people to stay at our bed & breakfast locations, hotels, eat at our restaurants, and shop at our main street.

The work involved with turning this vacant property includes: Clearing trees, removing section of guardrail, filling large ditch in middle of property with backfill products, creating small gravel parking area, sloping bank to allow for smooth access to lake which will include bank stabilization, installing a dock, clearing aquatic vegetation and sediment near launch site (DEC permit attached), installing lighting for park, signage. The total project cost is \$52,100.

- 3. Notice of Intent to Commence Work The permittee shall notify Doug Gaugler, DEC Bureau of Habitat, via electronic mail (doug.gaugler@dec.ny.gov) at least 48 hours in advance of the time of commencement.
- 4. Post Permit Sign The permit sign enclosed with this permit shall be posted in a conspicuous location on the worksite and adequately protected from the weather.
- 5. Silt Fence, or Other Erosion Controls, Downsbpe of Disturbed Area Silt fencing, or other effective means to control erosion, are to be used on the downslope edge of any disturbed upland areas, and around the perimeter of the planting material dewatering area, as shown on plans referenced in this permit.
- 6. Work Limited to Area Shown on Work Plan Disturbance to the bed and banks of Greenwood Lake, and Freshwater Wetland GR-5, shall be strictly limited to the work area identified in the work plan. The permittee and/or any project contractor(s) are prohibited from operating equipment in any other portion of Greenwood Lake without obtaining prior written approval from this Department.
- 7. Remove Temporary Gravel Ramp Upon Completion of Work. The proposed temporary gravel ramp, located in the 100 foot adjacent area of Freshwater Wetland GR-5, constructed in order to gain access to "Site #1 Proposed Hydrorake Channel" shall be removed upon completion of work. This area shall be restored and planted with trees as depicted on the approved plans referenced in Natural Resource Condition #2.
- 8. Plant Material Disposed at Upland Site After dewatering, any excavated plant material shall be immediately and completely disposed of on an approved upland site more than 100 feet from any waterbody, or regulated freshwater wetland. These materials shall be suitably stabilized so as not to reenter any water body, wetland, or adjacent area.
- 9. Seed, Mulch Disturbed Areas All areas of soil disturbance from this project (above the mean high water line) shall be seeded with an appropriate perennial grass seed and mulched with straw within one week of final grading.
- 10. No Interference With Navigation There shall be no unreasonable interference with navigation by the work herein authorized.
- 11. Precautions Against Contamination of Waters All necessary precautions shall be taken to preclude contamination of any wetland or waterway by suspended solids, sediments, fuels, solvents, lubricants, epoxy coatings, paints, concrete, leachate or any other environmentally deleterious materials associated with the project.



- 12.
